The Governing Body of the City of Paola, Kansas, met with Mayor Stuteville presiding.

Council Members present: Mayor Artie Stuteville and Council Members, Dave Smail, Trent Upshaw, Leigh House and LeAnne Shields.

Council Members absent: None

Also present: City Manager Sid Fleming, Assistant City Manager Randi Shannon, City Clerk Stephanie Marler, Interim Police Chief Eric Jenkins, City Attorney Lee Tetwiler, Public Works Director Kirk Rees, Public Works Employee Hayden Delmont, and Harold Mayes with Agler & Gaeddert.

CALL TO ORDER: The regular council meeting was called to order by Mayor Stuteville.

ROLL CALL: Mayor Stuteville and Council Members Smail, Upshaw, House and Shields were all present.

INTRODUCTION – Public Works Director Rees introduced a new employee, Hayden Delmont, who will be working with the water and wastewater department.

Agenda Item 3 – NEW BUSINESS

Agenda Item 3a – Audit Items

i. Presentation of the 2020 Audit Report by Harold Mayes of Agler & Gaeddert.

Mr. Harold Mayes with Agler & Gaeddert presented the 2020 Audit Report for the City of Paola. He reported that the opinion of the financial statements for the City is presented on a “cash basis” per the Kansas Municipal Audit and Accounting Guide and is fairly stated.

Mr. Mayes reviewed the summary statement of receipts and unencumbered cash balance at the end of 2020. He also discussed the funds for projects that were approved in 2020 but will not be spent until 2021 and noted the long-term debt balance has decreased.

Mr. Mayes discussed the potential pension liability for KPERS and KP&F. He noted as of December 31, 2020, the City’s proportionate share of the collective net pension liability reported to KPERS was \$1,681,783 and \$2,041,705 for KP&F.

Mr. Mayes pointed out a new Note in the audit report that is dealing with COVID-19 and they had not yet realized the full impact of the virus on the financial statements.

Mr. Mayes reviewed the Statement of Cash Receipts and Expenditures – Actual and Budget. He explained that this is the schedule that the State of Kansas is most interested in as it determines if there are any budget violations for the fiscal year. The schedule indicates the city had no unfavorable variances with the 2020 Budget.

With no further discussion Council Member House made a motion to accept the 2020 Audit Report from Agler & Gaeddert. The motion was seconded by Council Member Smail and all voted aye. The motion passed 4 to 0.

ii. Consider a Letter of Engagement for the 2021 audit.

Mr. Mayes presented a Letter of Engagement from Agler & Gaeddert for the preparation of the 2021 audit. The audit firm proposed a fee of \$15,400 plus out of pocket expenses.

Council Member Upshaw made a motion to accept the audit report [Letter of Engagement] with Agler & Gaeddert in the amount of \$15,400.00 plus out of pocket expenses. The motion was seconded by Council Member House and all voted aye. The motion passed 4 to 0.

iii. **Consider approving Resolution No 2021-008 waiving certain provisions of GAAP.**

Clerk Marler presented a Resolution requesting a waiver from conformance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles for 2021. Pursuant to Kansas Statutes, the city has the option of preparing all audit reports on a cash basis rather than accounting for the fixed assets of the city.

Council Member Shields made a motion to approve Resolution No 2021-008 waiving conformance with certain provisions of Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. The motion was seconded by Council Member Upshaw and all voted aye. The motion passed 4 to 0.

Agenda Item 3b – Codification of Ordinances for the City of Paola.

Manager Fleming stated the City of Paola currently utilizes a Municipal Code Book to organize a compilation of City ordinances. He said although the code is available on the website it is a group of unsearchable PDFs which make it difficult to navigate. He also noted the online code is only updated once per year.

Manager Fleming said the City has engaged Citycode Financial, LLC to complete a transition from the existing code to a new online format that is searchable. He said additionally, as new ordinances are passed and adopted, they will be incorporated into the online version shortly thereafter.

Manager Fleming presented Ordinance 3174 for consideration to formally approve and adopt the Codification of Ordinances prepared by Citycode Financial LLC.

Council Member Smail made motion to adopt Ordinance No 3174 for the Codification of Ordinances for the City of Paola and authorize the necessary signatures. The motion was seconded by Council Member House and all voted aye. The motion passed 4 to 0.

Agenda Item 3c - Consider a Conditional Use Permit for 604 N Silver St

Assistant Manager Shannon presented a request for a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) from PIT, LLC. She said the applicant is looking to reopen the gas station/convenience store as well as an unmanned U Haul Rental at 604 N Silver. She also noted that although this location was once a gas station, due to the discontinued use for a period longer than six months, it will require a CUP.

Assistant Manager Shannon said the Planning Commission held a public hearing on May 19, 2021 to discuss the CUP, one member of the public attended the meeting to speak in favor of the CUP. She said the following conditions were recommended by the Planning Commission:

- 1.) Lighting shall be all cut-off fixtures located to minimize impact on adjoining properties and comply with Article 12, DRAINAGE, UTILITIES, PARKING AND LIGHTING of the LDO.

- 2.) All rental units shall be parked in accordance with the parking setbacks stated in Article 4, Table 4.110A.
- 3.) All rental units shall be parked on paved, hard-surface.
- 4.) Until the gas station is open for service, there shall be a maximum of 6 rental units parked on paved, hard-surface areas.
- 5.) Once the gas station is operational, 4 of the six spaces shall be available for customer parking. The remaining two spaces will be available for rental unit parking. Applicant may add additional paved, hard-surface to the property at which time the CUP may be amended to provide space for additional rental unit parking.
- 6.) At any time, the City may institute revocation of the conditional use permit for violations of the conditions of approval, expiration, or the reasons specified in Section 21.225 of the Land Development Ordinance. The City shall provide notice to the landowner and public in the same manner as was provided for the establishment of the conditional use permit.

After further discussion Council Member Shields made a motion to adopt Ordinance No 3175 for the Conditional Use Permit located at 604 N Silver St and authorize the necessary signatures. The motion was seconded by Council Member House and all voted aye. The motion passed 4 to 0.

Agenda Item 3d – Final Plat for Hidden Meadows Phase III.

Assistant Manager Shannon presented the third and final plat for Hidden Meadows Estates Phase III. She said the applicant for this development is C3 Reality and includes the remaining 19 residential lots in the sub-division.

After some discussion Council Member Upshaw made a motion to approve the Final Plat for Hidden Meadows Phase III. The motion was seconded by Council Member Smail and all voted aye. The motion passed 4 to 0.

Manager Fleming reminded the Council of the upcoming meeting on Wednesday, June 9th with the Planning Commission for a Comprehensive Plan Analysis Review.

Manager Fleming said he invited the candidates for the upcoming election to an informational session on Thursday, June 17th.

Manager Fleming asked Mayor Stuteville if she would like to suggest a council representative to join a Recreation Commission task force. Mayor Stuteville ask Councilman Upshaw to join and he accepted.

Manager Fleming discussed the changes that have been made in the budget process for 2021 and suggests the Revenue Neutral Rate hearing be held.

Manager Fleming gave a project update on the following: Lake Miola Dam, Baptiste Drive Extension, Baptiste Drive and Hedge Lane, Water/Wastewater Master Plan and GIS training.

The Drinking Establishment License for Casa Grande at 120 W. Peoria will expire on August 6th.

Background

The Drinking Establishment License for Casa Grande Paola Mexican Restaurant at 120 W Peoria expires on August 6th. The owner will need to file the appropriate application, pay the license fee, and the facility will need the required fire safety inspection before the license can be renewed.

Issue

The City Council needs to take action to approve the renewal of this license. Due to the timing of monthly City Council Meetings, the application, required fee, and safety inspection have not been completed.

Summary

Notice has been sent to Casa Grande regarding the license renewal and they are expected to return the required documents before the August 6th expiration date.

Financial Impact (or Fiscal Note)

Casa Grande will pay the renewal fee of \$250 and the City will also benefit from the sales tax revenue.

Recommendations

Background

In 2016, the property at 401 E Kaskaskia was deemed a dangerous structure and the Paola City Council began the legal process to condemn the property. The property eventually sold, and the City Council made the decision to give the new owners an opportunity to fix the property and bring it out of its dangerous state.

Based on the condition of the property, the City required the new owners to provide an architecturally developed and review plan for the necessary repairs. Architectural plans were submitted in February 2021. Upon review and approval of these plans, a building permit was issued on March 11, 2021 to remodel this property. Due to no significant structural improvements to this property since 2016, the property owner was notified in writing that they had until June 15, 2021 to have a final inspection scheduled. The work is not at a place to warrant a final inspection. However Chief Building Inspector Bill Trout did a site check inspection on June 30, 2021.

Summary

Forty-five days after issuing the permit, staff had not observed any significant work on the project and proposed to begin the condemnation process. On May 11, 2021 the Paola City Council passed Resolution 2021-007 setting the public hearing for the condemnation of 401 E Kaskaskia for July 13, 2021. Attached to this memo is the site inspection report that was completed on June 30, 2021. A new inspection report will be provided by Inspector Bill Trout at the public hearing for review.

Attached is Inspector Trout's written statement stating the condition of 401 E Kaskaskia as of June 30, 2021. According to the inspection report there has been work done, but not all the architectural requirements per the submitted plans have been met. Passing Resolution 2021-013 would define 401 E Kaskaskia as a dangerous structure and would allow the City to give the owners a deadline of when the property needs to be repaired or demolished.

Legal Impact (or Review)

The City Attorney has reviewed proposed Resolution 2021-013.

Financial Impact

If the property owner does not abate the dangerous structure, the City would bid out the demolition, pay for the demolition, and then assess the demolition costs to the property's tax roll.

A RESOLUTION FINDING THAT THE STRUCTURE LOCATED AT LOT FIVE (5), BLOCK ONE HUNDRED TWO (102), CITY OF PAOLA, MIAMI COUNTY, KANSAS; COMMONLY KNOWN AS 401 E KASKASKIA STREET, PAOLA, KANSAS 66071 IS UNSAFE OR DANGEROUS AND DIRECTING THAT THE STRUCTURE BE REMOVED AND THE PREMISES MADE SAFE AND SECURE

WHEREAS, the Building Official of the City of Paola, Kansas, did on the 13th day of July, 2021 file with the Governing Body of said city a statement in writing stating that a certain structure, hereinafter described, was unsafe and dangerous; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body did by Resolution No. 2021-007 dated the 11th day of May, 2021, fix the time and place of a hearing at which the owner, his or her agent, and lienholders and all other parties of interest of such structures could appear and show cause why such structure should not be condemned and ordered repaired or demolished, and providing for giving notice thereof as provided by law; and,

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2021-007 was published in the official city paper on the 19th day of May, 2021, and on the 26th day of May, 2021, and a copy of said resolution was served upon all persons entitled thereto as provided by law; and,

WHEREAS, on this 13th day of July, 2021, the governing body did conduct the hearing scheduled in Resolution No. 2021-007,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PAOLA, KANSAS:

1. The Governing Body finds that the structure located at Lot Five (5), Block One Hundred Two (102), City of Paola, Miami County, Kansas; and commonly known as 401 E Kaskaskia, Paola, Kansas, is unsafe and dangerous and directs that such structure is to be removed and the premises made safe and secure.
2. The owner of such structure is hereby directed to have repairs completed within days (not later than the th day of , 2021). Provided, that upon due application by the owner and for good cause shown, the governing body, in its sole discretion, may grant the owner additional time to complete repairs or removal of the property.
3. If the owner fails to repair the structure and make it safe and secure within the time stated herein, or any additional time granted by the governing body, or fails to diligently prosecute the same until the work is completed, the governing body will cause the structure to be razed and removed and the costs of razing and removing, less salvage if any, shall be collected in the manner provided in K.S.A. 12-1, 1115, and amendments thereto or shall be assessed as a special assessment against the lot or parcel of land upon which the structure is located or by both, all as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the owner fails to commence the repair or removal of the structure within the time provided herein or fails to diligently prosecute the same, the governing body may take such further action as it deems necessary to raze and remove the structure without further notice to the owner or other parties in interest.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk shall cause this Resolution to be published once in the official city paper and mail a copy to the owners, agents, lienholders occupants, and other parties in interest.

This is an updated structural, code, and safety check report on the house at 401 E. Kaskaskia, Paola, KS 66071. The owner is working with the builder, Just Mietchen, to bring the house to code. It is unsafe and dangerous because:

1. There is no working plumbing;
2. There are no plug outlets hooked up or working, nor are there any lights hooked up inside the house;
3. The HVAC has not been ran upstairs, nor is it up to code. There are no vents or duct work, as per the code requires.;
4. The headers for the doors and windows need supported, as per code;
5. The old floor joists were removed and the new ones do not meet 2006 IRC codes. The joists in the living room are over span. An engineer must be used to address the over span issues.;
6. The first floor needs to be leveled and supported to support the dead and live loads.;
7. Fur downs need to be installed around all exposed plumbing and ductwork. Support needs added under the floor.;
8. The new porches on the west and south side of the house were not added to the plans. An engineer needs to approve them.;
9. The structural integrity of the basement needs to be evaluated by an engineer. There needs to be tuck pointing for the cracks in the basement walls, along with additional support.;
10. The outside doorway of the basement needs a code approved door.;
11. All of the glass and windows need to be repaired.;
12. The attic must be supported, as per code.;
13. This house is not to be occupied until it passes all inspections.

Introduction

The Miami County Fair Association is requesting the use of City-owned property in Wallace Park to hold the carnival for the Miami County Fair.

Background

Annually the Miami County Fair is held at the fairgrounds, which is County property, next to Wallace Park. The property owned by the Fair Association is not large enough to accommodate all of the activities of the fair so they would like to lease the area south of the loop road across from the playground. This is the area the carnival traditionally sets up in.

Legislation was signed into law July 1, 2017 regulating amusement rides. Since they are set up on City property, the lease agreement reflects the addition of the legislation. Additionally, the City has received complaints that the carnival was giving away animals as prizes for some of the games. This is a violation of KSA 21-6413 and is also reflected in the agreement.

Issue

Does the Council approve an agreement for the use of the area south of the loop road in Wallace Park?

Summary

The Miami County Fair Board has decided to continue with the County Fair and will need to use the City property to hold the carnival like in years past.

Legal Impact (or Review)

The agreement includes the following statement:

“The Miami County Fair Association will indemnify and hold the City, its Council Members and employees, harmless from any liability, costs or expenses, including attorney fees, and/or other expenses not covered by the Association’s insurance policy, that may arise as a result of the operation of the fair, or any and all activities associated therewith during the term of this lease”

Financial Impact (or Fiscal Note)

The lease agreement is in consideration of \$.50.

Alternatives

The Council could elect not to lease the property to the Fair Association.

Recommendations

I recommend the approval of the lease agreement with the Miami County Fair Association and authorize the necessary signatures.

The **Miami County Fair Association** will be responsible for electrical wiring and electrical energy required; and

The **Miami County Fair Association** shall comply with all of the laws of the State of Kansas, specifically including both K.S.A. 21-6413 and K.S.A. 44-1601 et seq., copies of which are attached hereto and by this reference thereto made a part hereof the same as if fully set forth herein.

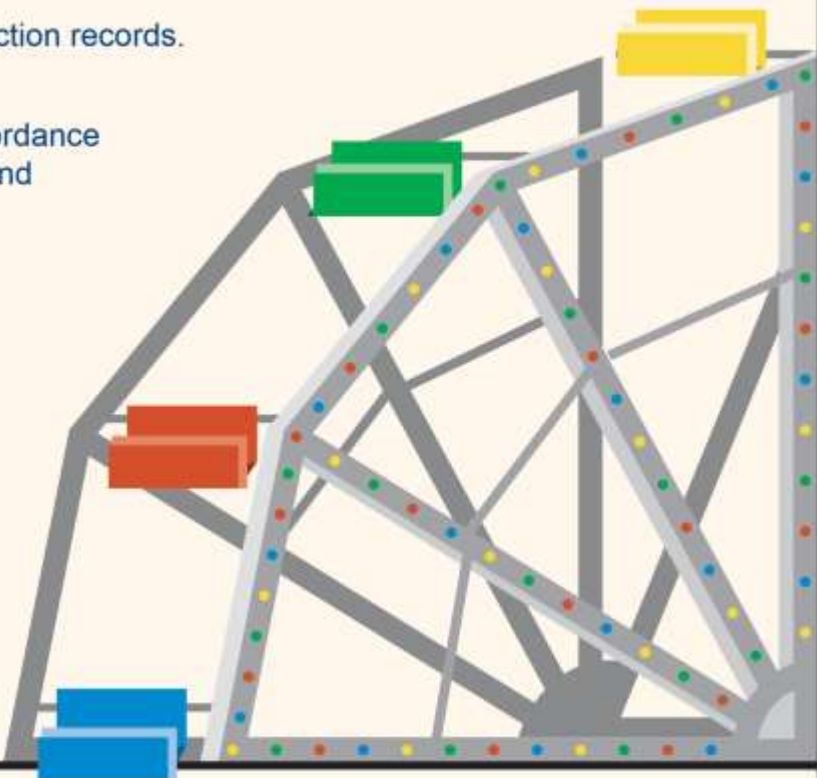

Introduction

Dr. Aaron Stohs currently owns three vet clinics located in Drexel, Louisburg, and Paola. The Paola Vet Clinic is looking for a location to build a new clinic due business growth. Dr. Stohs contacted our office and expressed interest in the opportunity to build in the Paola Industrial Park.

Background

The Clinic is outgrowing its current location and is looking to expand their facility to be able to increase their scope of practice and recruit more clients from outside of Paola to come to town for veterinary care, as well as employment opportunities. The services that are currently offered, and will continue to be offered if expanded are as follows:

- Small animal medicine and surgery
- Animal reproduction
- Chiropractic care
- Emergency veterinary services
- Retail area for pet food and supplies

The new additional services that would be offered with the new facility are as follows:

- Cattle and equine haul in facility
- Boarding
- Grooming
- Doggy Daycare

Dr. Stohs is looking to build an approximate 7,600 square foot steel framed building to include 6 exam rooms, a surgery room, boarding and grooming area, and a large animal services area. The Paola Clinic currently employs 10 full time and 2 part time employees. With the new facility they estimate to be able to employ 20 full time and 6 part time employees at full capacity. With the new facility, Dr. Stohs would be interested in hosting high school students interested in a career in veterinary medicine and provide tours and educational resources for the local FFA, 4-H Clubs, or any other clubs interested.

Discussion

The Land Purchase Agreement allows for the purchase of the property for \$1.00 and other considerations, which include the following:

- a. Legal survey and preparation of any necessary easements for utilities and or drainage;
- b. Title Insurance for Tract 5, at Buyer's option;
- c. Preparation and recording of Deeds;
- d. Buyer agrees to install curb and gutters on the subject property along Industrial Park Drive.

The Buyer will have twenty-four (24) months from the date of closing to start substantial construction or the land shall be deeded back to the City. If the lot is sold by the Buyer to a third party before a commercial building is built, or within twenty-four (24) months from the date of closing, then any profit made from the sale shall be split equally between the Buyer and the City.

Legal Impact (or Review)

The City Attorney has been consulted on this issue and reviewed this contract.

Financial Impact (or Fiscal Note)

The City would be selling the land in the Industrial Park for \$1.00 and other consideration. According to our most recent appraisal, the land in the Paola Industrial Park is appraised at \$35,000 per acre. The proposed land is approximately 8 acres, which makes the total value of the land given to the developers approximately \$280,000. No other incentives are being considered at this time.

Action

Motion to authorize the Mayor to execute the Land Purchase Agreement on behalf of the City with Drexel Veterinary Clinic, P.C., on Tract 5 in the Industrial Park, in substantially the form presented, and authorize the necessary signatures.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this day by and between City of Paola, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as "Seller", and Drexel Vet Clinic, P.C., a Missouri Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Buyer".

WHEREAS, the Seller is the owner of the hereinafter described land and real estate and desires to sell the same to the Buyer, and the Buyer desires to purchase the same from the Seller upon the terms and conditions and for the consideration hereinafter set forth, this Agreement is now made. IT IS NOW THEREFORE AGREED by and between the parties that:

1. Sale. The Seller shall and it does hereby agree to sell to the Buyer and the Buyer hereby agrees to purchase from the Seller the following described land and real estate situated in Miami County, Kansas, to-wit:

Tract 5:

All that part of Lot 3, Block 1, of Paola Industrial Park, an addition to the City of Paola, Miami County, Kansas in the Southwest Quarter of Section 10, Township 17 South, Range 23 East, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at Northeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of said Section 10; thence N89°45'50"W, along the North line of said Southwest Quarter, also being the North line of said Block 1, a distance of 1606.40 feet, to a point 131.10 feet West of the Northeast corner of said lot 3, also being the Point of Beginning; thence S0°00'00"E, parallel to the East line of said lot 3, a distance of 691.73 feet, to a point of the Northerly right-of-way line of Industrial Park Drive; thence N89°37'17"W, along said right-of-way line, a distance of 517.18 feet, to the Southwest corner of said lot 3; thence N0°00'00"W, a distance of 690.44 feet, to the Northwest corner of said lot 3; thence S89°45'50"E, a distance of 517.17 feet, to the Point Beginning, Containing 8.20 Acres more or less.

and in consideration of said sale, it is agreed that the Buyer shall pay to the Seller the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), the receipt of which One Dollar is hereby acknowledged by the Seller to have been paid, and other valuable consideration that the Buyer shall pay for, namely:

- a. Legal survey and preparation of any necessary easements for utilities and or drainage;
- b. Title Insurance for Tract 5, at Buyer's option;
- c. Preparation and recording of Deeds;
- d. Buyer agrees to install curb and gutters on the subject property along Industrial Park Drive.

and as further consideration, the Buyer shall and does hereby agree to waive any and all rights that it may have to oppose the formation of a Benefit District for the payment of the construction and paving of streets, curbs and gutters in the Industrial Park, and the Buyer does hereby specifically agree to pay its portion of the costs of the same.

As a condition to the performance of the City's obligations under this contract, the Buyer hereby consents to the formation by the City of a benefit district pursuant to K.S.A. 12-6a01 *et seq.*, (the "Act") to provide for the improvement of Industrial Parkway by paving, the addition of a sidewalk and all related and necessary structures, as shall be determined by the City (the "Benefit District") and to the inclusion of the property described in this contract (the "Property") in the Benefit District. Buyer hereby (i) waives any formal notice of the creation of the Benefit District by the City, (ii) specifically requests and consents to the inclusion of the Property in such Benefit District without Buyer signing any petition or making any other formal request, and (iii) agrees to the levy of special assessments against the Property to pay a proportionate share of the cost of such benefit district improvements, all as provided in the Act.

2. Title Insurance. At the Buyer's discretion, the Seller shall furnish to the Buyer, at Buyer's expense, a written commitment of a title insurance company authorized to do business in the State of Kansas to issue a title policy insuring the Buyer against loss of title to the above-described land and real estate, which policy shall except easements and restrictions of record, specifically including, but not limited to, the Paola Industrial Park Covenants and Restrictions as set forth in City of Paola's Resolution No. 9-14-82A and any provisions contained in City of Paola Comprehensive Plan of 2006 and Zoning and Subdivision Regulations Ordinance No. 2347 and the parties hereby acknowledge that the aforesaid real estate is subject to Covenants and Restrictions set forth in said Resolution. The Buyer shall have ten days after receipt of said written title commitment within which to examine the same and to notify the Seller of its objections thereto by delivering a written statement setting forth the same to it. If such notification is not given within said time, then marketability of said title shall be deemed acceptable to the Buyer and a title policy shall be issued and delivered to the Buyer in accordance with said commitment. If the Buyer has presented a written statement stating objections, the Seller shall have a reasonable time thereafter within which to make the title insurable, it being specifically agreed that the Seller shall furnish to the Buyer an insured title in and to said land and real estate.

3. Deed. Simultaneous with the execution of this Agreement, the Seller shall execute a Kansas Business Organization Warranty Deed conveying the above-described land and real estate, free and clear from any and all encumbrances, except easements and restrictions of record, to the Buyer.

4. Taxes. The Seller pays no real estate taxes on the afore-described land and real estate, but after closing Buyer will be responsible for the payment of any real estate taxes on said land and real estate if the Buyer is legally obligated to pay said taxes.

5. Closing. It is the parties' specific intent to close this transaction on or before the _____ day of _____, 2021.

6. Default. In the event the Seller is unable to furnish marketable title in and to the above-described land and real estate, then this Agreement shall be null and void, and in that event, the Seller shall return to the Buyer the down payment made by it to apply upon the purchase price of said land and real estate, and it is agreed in that event that neither of the parties hereto shall be liable one to the other by reason of failure to furnish marketable title and make conveyance as provided by this Agreement. In other words, the parties hereto are to be placed in status quo with the same and like effect as though this Agreement had never been entered into, and the parties released and relieved of all liability one to the other.

In the event that the Buyer shall fail, refuse, or neglect to carry out any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement on its part to be performed and make payment of the consideration as herein provided, this Agreement shall, at the option of the Seller, be null and void and in that event, the Seller shall keep and retain the down payment as and for its liquidated damages.

The Buyer hereby specifically agrees that in the event the Buyer has not started construction of a commercial building on the afore-described land within twenty-four (24) months from the date of closing, that then and in either or any of said events, the Buyer shall and

does hereby agree that it has breached this contract, is in default and shall deed the subject land and real estate back to the Seller when requested in writing by the Seller to do so.

If the afore-described land and real estate or any part thereof is sold by the Buyers to a third party before a commercial building is constructed thereon or within twenty-four (24) month from the date of closing, then and in that event, any profit received by the Buyers (profit equals gross sale price, less real estate commission, less closing costs, less any directly related improvement or marketing expenses incurred by the Buyers in regard to the afore-described land and real estate) shall be split equally by the Seller and the Buyers.

7. Possession. The possession of the afore-described land and real estate shall be transferred from the Seller to the Buyer at the time of closing or at such time as the parties may mutually agree upon.

8. Hay Lease. The Seller shall notify the existing tenant that the current hay lease, if any, shall terminate.

9. Utility Easements. Upon the Seller's written request, the Buyer shall grant to the Seller utility easements for the purpose of installing, relocating, maintaining, and repairing Seller's utilities on or across the subject property, including the right of ingress and egress thereto.

10. Costs. The Buyer shall pay the Seller for costs incurred as specifically set forth in paragraph 1 herein, said sums to be paid by the Buyer prior to the closing hereof.

11. Binding Clause. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, administrators, devisees, trustees, and assigns of the parties hereto, and time shall be and is of the essence of this Agreement.

12. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same agreement.

Introduction

Applicant, Nick Hart owns Lot 1 of Burr Oak Estates which is currently 15.27 acres. He is wanting to split the lot into three tracts to allow for two additional single-family homes.

Background

At its meeting on June 15, 2021 the Paola Planning Commission recommended approval of the final plat with the condition of the access drive be platted as a private access and not dedicated to the City as a public street. The Planning Commission voted in favor.

Summary

The Burr Oak Estates subdivision is currently zoned as Suburban, which requires a minimum of 12,500 sq. ft. lots for single-family conventional homes. Each of the proposed new lots exceeds this requirement. The new lots would take access from the existing private drive through access easements. The Planning Commission recommended the access to be platted as a private drive due to no adequate emergency turn-around available to meet the City standards.

Discussion

Does the City Council approve the replat of Lot 1, Burr Oak Estates?

Alternatives

Section 21.161 Action by City Council

1. Shall consider the recommendation from the Planning Commission and take action by majority vote of the members present.

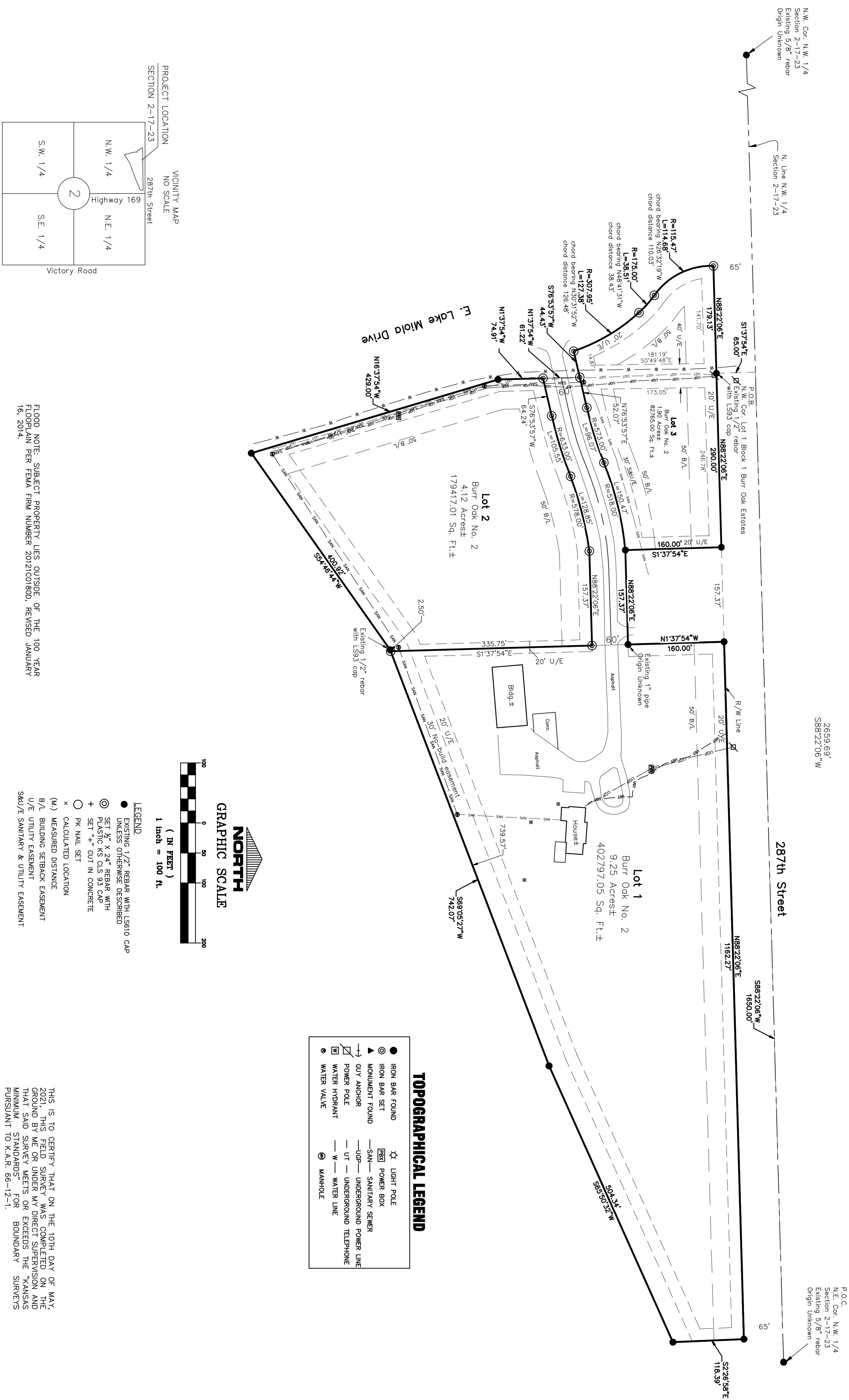

Background

Public Works-Streets has two big street projects (Baptiste Extension and the Right Turn Lane) going on this year and has a couple of smaller projects that it would like to pursue. One is some major patching on 295th Street between Old KC Road and the city limits. This would include repairing seven locations with 6" of asphalt patching. The second project would conduct a 2" mill and overlay on West Piankishaw between Silver and Iron.

Summary

At the end of May, Public Works-Streets contacted three contractors for quotes on the proposed repair work. One contractor did not provide a quote, because the project was too small. However, they did pass along the quote request to another contractor, so three quotes were received and reviewed. The quotes are summarized below.

CONTRACTOR	TOTAL BID
<i>Way & Sons Construction</i>	<i>\$68,619.00</i>
Killough Construction, Inc.	\$73,567.00
McAnany Construction	\$88,876.00

Discussion

After reviewing the quotes, Way and Sons Construction was the low bidder. Although Ways & Sons has not performed work for the City, they have paved some parking lots in town. After discussing their quality of work with Building Inspector Bill Trout, Public Works Staff felt comfortable with recommending Way & Sons Construction for the 2021 Asphalt Road Repairs.

Public Works Staff contacted Way & Sons Construction to ensure that the pricing would hold until Council approval. They did submit an updated price that was \$229 more than the original quote and was based on updated asphalt pricing. Even with this slight adjustment, Way & Sons Construction provides the best price and value for the City.

Financial Impact

The expenditure for these two small projects would be taken from the Street Repair Fund (17). As of May 31, 2021, the cash balance in the fund was 199,126.78

Recommendations

Background

During the 2021 Budget process, staff discussed making adjustments to the Water Utility and Wastewater Utility budgeting. This included consolidating the savings for capital projects into a single fund for the Water Utility. Additionally, the operational funds for the Wastewater Utility would be consolidated and a single fund would be established for capital projects in the Wastewater Utility.

Historically, wastewater operational spending was spread across the Sewer Service Fund (04) and the Wastewater Treatment Plant Fund (16). Traditionally, money was saved into the Bull Creek Interceptor Fund (11) and Wastewater Treatment Plant Construction Fund (32), which served as potential funding sources for larger sewer-related projects. All sewer or wastewater treatment related operational and maintenance costs will be consolidated into the renamed Fund-04, which becomes the Wastewater Utility Fund (04). Fund-16 is renamed and repurposed as the Wastewater Utility CIP Fund (16). This fund will become the single repository savings for future capital projects.

Discussion

With the conclusion of the 2020 Audit and based on the cash balances as of June 30, 2021, staff has outlined a series of transfers to consolidate the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) savings for both the Water Utility and Wastewater Utility. Transfers have also been outlined to consolidate the operational activities for the Wastewater Utility.

The CIP funds help plan and fund capital projects related to each respective utility. Moving forward, a portion of utility revenue will be transferred to the respective utility's CIP fund each year. Both the Water Utility and Wastewater Utility also had some various project costs in the Capital Improvement Projects Fund 90. The fund consolidation process also serves to "zero out" the utility savings found in various Fund-90 funds.

Resolution 2021-009: Water Utility Fund Consolidation has been prepared for Council's consideration and reflects the fund consolidation for the Water Utility. The resolution would authorize the transfer as outlined in Table 2 (below).

Resolution 2021-010: Wastewater Utility Fund Consolidation has been prepared for Council's consideration and reflects the fund consolidation for the Wastewater Utility. The resolution would authorize the transfers as outlined in Table 4 (below).

Legal Impact (or Review)

The City Attorney has reviewed the resolutions.

Financial Impact (or Fiscal Note)

Table 1 shows the cash balance in the various funds associated with Water Utility capital savings, and Table 2 shows the proposed consolidation transfer for the Water Utility. The transfer would take funds from the Water Utility CIP Fund (15) and repay the negative balance shown in CIP - Pressure Reducing Valves (90-308). The final balance for Water Utility CIP Fund (15) will be \$108,562.21.

Fund-16 will then receive transfers from Funds 11, 31, 90-310, and 90-312. The ending balance for the Wastewater Utility CIP Fund (16) will be \$974,382.64. Table 4 reflects the proposed consolidation transfers for the Wastewater Utility.

Background

With legislation passed earlier this year, the budget process has changed. The tax lid has been removed. In its place, new notice and public hearing requirements have been established. These requirements became effective this year and guide the 2022 Budget process.

The legislation found in Senate Bill 13 and House Bill 2104 require special notice and a separate public hearing if our “proposed budget will exceed the property tax levy’s Revenue Neutral Rate (RNR).” An infographic developed by the League of Kansas Municipalities is attached and provides additional information on this legislation.

Discussion

At the Council Work-Study Session on July 6, 2021, staff presented the preliminary draft of the 2022 Budget and discussed the requirements and impacts of SB 13. The preliminary draft budget indicated that a levy of a property tax exceeding the RNR will be required. Based on the preliminary draft of the 2022 Budget, the current valuation estimates, and its understanding of the SB 13 requirements, City staff recommends that the City declare its intent to levy a property tax rate exceeding the Revenue Neutral Rate.

Resolution 2021-011: 2022 Budget – Intent to Exceed RNR has been prepared to provide notice of the City’s intent to exceed the RNR. This notice will be sent to the Miami County Clerk. The resolution also sets the public hearing for the intent to exceed the RNR for Tuesday, September 14, 2021.

Legal Review

The resolution was drafted utilizing a model resolution developed by the League of Kansas Municipalities.

Financial Impact

If the City fails to express its intent to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate by July 20th, it will have to refund any tax levied in excess of the Revenue Neutral Rate.

Section 1. The Governing Body of the City of Paola hereby sets a public hearing regarding its intention to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate for September 14, 2021 at 6:00 pm to be held at 805 N Pearl, Paola, KS 66071 and directs that notice of the public hearing be given as required by state law.

Section 2. The Governing Body of the City of Paola expresses its intention to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate with a maximum mill levy of 47.000 mills.

Section 3. The Governing Body of the City of Paola directs the City Clerk to provide this resolution to the Miami County Clerk as notice of the City's proposed intent to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate.

This resolution shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption and shall remain in effect until future action is taken by the Governing Body.

The Basics of SB 13/HB 2104: Legislation Requiring a Hearing to Exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate

What are SB 13 and HB 2104?

During the 2021 legislative session, the tax lid was removed and the legislature enacted SB 13 and HB 2104. This legislation establishes new notice and public hearing requirements if the proposed budget will exceed the property tax levy's revenue neutral rate. These requirements take effect this year (2021), for a city's 2022 budget.

What is a Revenue Neutral Rate (RNR)?

The tax rate in mills that would generate the same property tax revenue in dollars as levied the previous tax year using the current tax year's total assessed valuation.

How is the Revenue Neutral Rate Calculated?

To calculate the revenue neutral rate, the County Clerk shall divide the property tax revenue for such taxing subdivision levied for the previous tax year by the total of all taxable assessed valuation in such taxing subdivision for the current tax year, and then multiply the quotient by 1,000 to express the rate in mills. (SB 13 Sec. 1(e)(2))

What is a Tax Rate Hearing?

A Tax Rate Hearing is a hearing to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate (RNR).

$$\text{RNR} = \frac{\text{Last year's total property tax raised in dollars}}{\text{This year's assessed valuation as of June 15}} \times 1,000$$

Year-to-Year RNR Sample Calculation

2021 Budget

- City Levied \$900,000 in property tax
- Assessed Valuation of property = \$29,000,000
- Value of one mill = \$29,000
- Mill Rate = $\left(\frac{\$900,000}{\$29,000,000} \right) \times 1,000$
31.034 mills

2022 Budget

- In 2021 budget, City levied \$900,000
- Assessed Valuation changes to \$31,000,000
- Value of one Mill = \$31,000 $\times 1,000$
- Revenue Neutral Rate = $\left(\frac{\$900,000}{\$31,000,000} \right)$
29.032 Mills

What is the Process to Exceed the RNR (setting a mill levy higher than the RNR)?

1. Notify the County Clerk by July 20 with intent to exceed the revenue neutral rate.
2. Place a notice on the city website and in a newspaper of general circulation in the county by September 10 (and 10 days prior to the hearing).
3. By September 20, conduct a tax rate and budget hearing giving taxpayers an opportunity to comment on the budget.
4. Adopt a resolution or ordinance to exceed the revenue neutral rate.
5. Adopt the proposed budget.
6. By October 1, certify to the County Clerk the amount of ad valorem tax to be levied by the City.



1. The tax lid was about actual dollars. The revenue neutral rate is about the MILL LEVY not total dollars!
2. If the City does not hold a hearing to exceed the revenue neutral rate, the City will need to work with the County Clerk to ensure that, when final assessed values are calculated, the City's mill levy does not exceed the revenue neutral rate. If it does, the city will need to amend the budget or refund any property taxes levied in excess of the revenue neutral rate.

Applying SB 13/HB 2104 to the Budget Process

STEP 1

Receive Revenue Neutral Rate from the County Clerk by June 15.

STEP 2

Determine the budget needs for City's upcoming budget year and determine the amount of property tax will be required to fund the budget.

STEP 3

Determine if the amount needed will require a tax levy exceeding the Revenue Neutral Rate.

If YES, follow these steps:

1. Notify the County Clerk by July 20 with the City's intent to exceed the revenue neutral rate.
2. Beginning in 2021 (for 2022 budget year), publish a notice on the city website and a newspaper of general circulation in the county. Notice must be given 10 days before the hearing. The notice must provide details for both a tax rate hearing and budget hearing.
3. By September 20, conduct a tax rate AND budget hearing. A tax rate hearing is defined as a hearing to exceed the RNR. Adopt a resolution or ordinance to exceed the RNR.
4. Adopt the proposed budget or any lesser amount. A budget cannot exceed the amount proposed.
5. On or before October 1, certify to the County Clerk the amount to be levied.

If NO, follow these steps:

1. On or before August 5, publish the proposed budget and hearing notice (must include the RNR).
2. On or before August 15, hold a public hearing on the budget.
3. On or before August 25, certify the City budget and tax levies to the County Clerk.

NOTE: If the City does not hold a hearing to exceed the revenue neutral rate, the City will need to work with the County Clerk to ensure that, when final assessed values are calculated, the City's mill levy does not exceed the revenue neutral rate. If it does, the city will need to amend the budget or refund any property taxes levied in excess of the revenue neutral rate.



Beginning in 2022, the County Clerk will mail Revenue Neutral Rate notifications to all taxpayers.

Background

On Thursday, March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), providing \$1.9 trillion in economic stimulus to assist in the long-term recovery from the economic and public health impacts related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

ARPA provides direct aid to cities, towns, and villages. Allocations for “metropolitan cities” (population greater than 50,000) have previously been released. The provisions of ARPA require the State of Kansas to distribute financial relief payments directly to non-entitlement units of local government (“NEUs” defined as cities with populations less than 50,000) on behalf of the federal government. Allocation amounts for NEUs are based on population proportionality and are capped at 75% of the 2020 budget (as of January 27, 2020). The City of Paola’s ARPA allocation is \$867,610.08.

Discussion

Resolution No 2021-012 has been prepared to officially accept the ARPA funding from the State of Kansas. Once approved, an application will be processed to request the disbursement of funds. Applications to receive funds must be submitted no later than July 26, 2021. The first half of the City’s allocation will be disbursed after the application has been accepted, and the second half will be disbursed in 2022. The City will have until December 31, 2024, to spend the funds.

As a condition of receipt of federal financial assistance, an authorized representative of the City of Paola must sign the *Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements* along with the *Terms and Conditions* set by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

This process is similar to the acceptance of the Coronavirus Relief Funds offered by Miami County via the CARES Act, which occurred in 2020.

Legal Review

Guidance from the League of Kansas Municipalities suggests, as a best practice, passing a resolution to accept the ARPA funds. The City Attorney has reviewed *Resolution 2021-012: Accepting ARPA Funds*.

Financial Impact

The City of Paola will receive \$867,610.08 in ARPA funds. The money will be put in a special purpose fund for tracking.

Recommendations

Approve *Resolution 2021-012: Accepting ARPA Funds* to accept funds allocated to the City of Paola by the State of Kansas through the State's American Rescue Plan Act Fund and agree to the *Terms and Conditions* and the *Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements* and authorize the necessary signatures.

RESOLUTION 2021-012

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE INTENT OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PAOLA, KANSAS TO ACCEPT ANY FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE CITY BY STATE OF KANSAS THROUGH THE STATE'S AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUND AND ACKNOWLEDGING THAT ACCEPTANCE AND USE OF FUNDS SHALL BE SUBJECT TO TERMS DESIGNED TO ENSURE TRANSPARENCY, EQUITY, AND ACCOUNTABILITY IN THE LAWFUL USE OF THE FUNDS.

WHEREAS, securing the health, safety, and economic well-being of our residents is CITY OF PAOLA'S top priority;

WHEREAS, CITY OF PAOLA is facing both a public health and economic crisis – the pandemic and public health emergency of COVID-19 – which has resulted in illness, quarantines, school closures, and temporary closure of businesses resulting in lost wages and financial hardship to Kansas citizens;

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization declared a pandemic on March 11, 2020;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States pursuant to Sections 201 and 301 of the National Emergencies Act, 50 U.S.C. § 1601, et seq. and consistent with Section 1135 of the Social Security Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. § 1320b-5), declared a national emergency that the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States constitutes a national emergency beginning March 1, 2020;

WHEREAS, as of this date, in MIAMI COUNTY there have been 2,836 reported positive cases of COVID-19, and 41 deaths;

WHEREAS, CITY OF PAOLA must remain flexible to account for the evolving nature and scope of the unprecedented public health emergency posed by COVID-19, while also simultaneously beginning the process of economic recovery and revitalization;

WHEREAS, for the aforementioned and other reasons, and in recognition and furtherance of our responsibility to provide for and ensure the health, safety, security, and welfare of the people of CITY OF PAOLA, CITY OF PAOLA has determined that the evolving public health and economic threats posed by COVID-19 require a proactive approach to provide immediate financial relief and long-term economic investment to communities within CITY OF PAOLA;

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021 the President of the United States signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to provide continued relief from the impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic; and

WHEREAS, approximately \$350 billion of the ARPA funding was allotted to assist state, local, tribal, and territory governments in responding to the coronavirus pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF PAOLA is expected to receive \$867,610.08 in funding; such funding to be received in two tranches, approximately one half within 60 days of the plan passage, and the remaining funding approximately 12 months later, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to the authority vested in the PAOLA CITY COUNCIL, including the authority granted to this body by constitutional home rule in order to continue the process of safely, strategically, and proactively providing the resources the city needs to both mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and invest in long-term economic recovery, the PAOLA CITY COUNCIL accepts the allocation of funds from the Federal Government through the American Rescue Plan Act; and such funds will be placed in a special revenue fund for the sole purpose of tracking all approved transactional activities.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the CITY OF PAOLA will adhere to the existing, additional, and amended guidelines as set forth by the federal government in the allocation or distribution of said funds, including the *Assurances of Compliance with Civil Rights Requirements* and the *Terms and Conditions* set by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

This document shall be filed with the Paola City Clerk. It shall become effective as of July 13, 2021.
